Institutional Research Standards and Evidence Framework

1. PURPOSE

The purpose of this framework is to establish the research standards, evidential discipline, methodological neutrality, and analytical restraint principles governing research activity associated with the Black Justice Research Institute (“BJRI”).

The Institute recognises that institutional credibility depends substantially upon careful methodology, procedural fairness, safeguarding awareness, and responsible evidential standards.

2. CORE RESEARCH PRINCIPLES

The Institute supports:

- evidential discipline,
- analytical restraint,
- methodological neutrality,
- recognition of uncertainty where appropriate,
- lawful conduct,
- safeguarding awareness,
- and careful documentation standards.

The Institute rejects:

- predetermined ideological conclusions,
- manipulative framing,
- distortion of evidence,
- inflammatory conduct,
- and speculative assertion presented as established fact.

3. EVIDENTIAL DISTINCTIONS

The Institute distinguishes between:

- verified fact,
- allegation,
- disputed claim,
- reported experience,
- hypothesis,
- perception,
- and speculation.

Research activity should therefore avoid presenting uncertainty as established certainty where appropriate evidential foundation does not exist.

4. PROCEDURAL FAIRNESS

Research and analytical activity associated with the Institute should remain proportionate, procedurally fair, and consistent with lawful conduct obligations.

The Institute recognises that procedural fairness is necessary to support:

- institutional legitimacy,
- public trust,
- safeguarding,
- and evidential credibility.

5. SAFEGUARDING RESPONSIBILITIES

The Institute recognises safeguarding obligations within:

- research activity,
- public communications,
- publication practices,
- institutional conduct,
- and digital activity.

Research should therefore avoid:

- harassment,
- inflammatory escalation,

- coercive practices,
- collective hostility,
- and unsafe publication behaviour.

6. DOCUMENTATION STANDARDS

Research associated with the Institute should support:

- careful documentation,
- source preservation where appropriate,
- evidential transparency,
- uncertainty recognition,
- and responsible analytical conduct.

7. PUBLIC COMMUNICATIONS

Public communication of research activity should avoid:

- ideological absolutism,
- inflammatory rhetoric,
- unsupported accusations,
- and speculative conclusions presented as verified fact.

The Institute supports careful language, restraint, procedural clarity, and evidence-based discussion.

8. INSTITUTIONAL RESPONSIBILITY

The Institute recognises that long-term institutional credibility depends substantially upon:

- neutrality,
- proportionality,
- safeguarding seriousness,
- evidential discipline,
- lawful conduct,
- and responsible institutional behaviour.

9. CONCLUSION

The Institute's research standards framework is grounded in evidential discipline, analytical restraint, methodological neutrality, safeguarding awareness, procedural fairness, and lawful conduct.

The Institute supports careful evidence-based analysis rather than ideologically driven or inflammatory approaches to research activity.
