Digital Infrastructure Supporting the Reparations Infrastructure Platform

Purpose

This paper introduces the technology vision supporting the African Reparations Movement. It explains how digital systems can strengthen participation, research, evidence management and international collaboration.

Digital Identity

A secure identity platform can enable supporters, researchers, volunteers and partner organisations to participate in projects while maintaining appropriate governance and privacy protections.

Evidence and Knowledge

Technology can assist with structured evidence collection, document management, historical research, searchable archives and knowledge sharing across jurisdictions.

Artificial Intelligence

AI may support document analysis, translation, information retrieval and research assistance. Human oversight remains essential for important decisions and published conclusions.

Global Collaboration

The long-term objective is to provide shared digital infrastructure that helps organisations cooperate while remaining independent. The platform is intended to encourage interoperability rather than centralisation.

Technology is a tool that supports people, institutions and ideas. Combined with transparent governance and research, it can help build practical infrastructure for the global reparations movement.
